## PLEASE READ – RULES, REGULATIONS and CONDUCT

**Campsite Fees:** Self-pay, cash or check, *due in advance and immediately upon arrival.*

**\$25 With Power and/or Water hook-ups** (Includes Sewage/Gray Water Dump Station Fee)

**\$20 No Power or Water hook-ups** (Dump Station fee not included)

**\$5 Sewage/Gray Water Dump Station Fee**

Register at yellow mailbox in Campground. Place payment in the white envelope, fill in information completely, and drop in the yellow metal pay box next to yellow registration mailbox. Use brown "Dump" envelopes to pay \$5 Sewage/Gray Water Dump Station Fee.

*Failure to complete registration envelope properly, or supply inaccurate information, is a violation of the Rules and Regulations, and could delay appropriate credit for your campsite. The Port is not responsible for any errors resulting from incomplete registration envelopes. The Port reserves the right to refuse service if these Rules and Regulations are not followed.*

### Camping Rules & Regulations:

1. Campsite spaces are first-come/first-served basis.
2. Check-out time: 11:00 a.m. To avoid another nightly charge, you must vacate by 11 a.m.
3. Occupy only the camp space you have paid for. If you are parked and occupying more space than you have paid for, you must pay for the extra space(s).
4. Camping is only allowed in the designated campsite spaces within the Campground.
5. Maximum Stay: 14 days within 30 days, unless authorized for a longer stay by the Property Manager: [fairgroundsmanager@portofsouthwhidbey.com](mailto:fairgroundsmanager@portofsouthwhidbey.com), 360-221-7950.
6. Firearms and Fireworks are prohibited at all times.
7. Fires must be contained in a metal container not touching the ground, with water on-hand for emergency. Island County Burn Bans are an exception in hot, dry weather.
8. Alert the Campground Host of fires or emergencies, after calling 911 first.
9. Closed to the public July 9-24, 2018, for the Whidbey Island Fair (could re-open July 14-15, 2018 for Ragnar NW Passage registrants, please email/call for info).

### Campground Conduct:

- Quiet Hours: 9 p.m. – 8 a.m., seven (7) days a week, per City of Langley Noise Ordinance.
- Alcohol consumption is permitted only at your campsite space. The law forbids open containers of alcohol in public spaces. No walking around consuming alcohol.
- Behavior which disturbs or creates a nuisance for others in the Campground or in the vicinity of Fairgrounds property is prohibited. Call 911 if issues persist.
- No smoking allowed on Fairgrounds and Campground property. Smoking is permitted in your vehicle, trailer, or tent only.
- Children 15 & under must be accompanied by an adult at all times. No exceptions.
- You must maintain a clean and orderly campsite - no clutter and personal belongings scattered about. Clothes lines are prohibited.
- Speed Limit: 5 MPH at all times.



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**Maximum Occupancy and Party Size per Campsite Space:**

- One vehicle and one RV/Trailer per space
- Two vehicles and two small to medium-sized tents per space
- Two vehicles and one large to extra-large-sized tent per space
- Maximum of six (6) people per campsite space per overnight stay
- Free overflow parking is located parallel along the fence-line or within the Fairgrounds.

**Restroom/Shower Facilities:**

- Restrooms/showers are available for all paying campers during their stay. After registering and paying, please check with the Campground Host or Property Manager for details.

**Garbage Disposal:**

- Garbage cans are available for campers during their overnight stay. No dumping of large quantities of trash; penalty will result with a \$150 fine, and/or removal off of Fairgrounds and Campground property. No exceptions.

**Sewage/Gray Water Dump Disposal - By Order of the Island County Health Department:**

- The sewage/gray water dumping station is on the southwest side of the Campgrounds. Gray water/sewage dumping anywhere else is prohibited, from a holding tank, containers, or hose. Persons defecating outside anywhere on Fairgrounds/Campground property is against the law. Violation of any of these laws will result in immediate removal off Fairgrounds and Campground property, and a Trespassing Admonishment from Langley Police may occur.

**Pet Control:**

- Pets must be on a leash at all times; leash should not be longer than eight feet and owner must be in control of the pet at all times. Pet fencing within your campsite is allowed to control your pet. Pet owners are responsible to clean up pet waste and dispose of properly in garbage cans.

**Vehicle Licensing:**

- All vehicles, RVs and trailers (motorized or not), must be currently registered, licensed, fully operational, in good working order, and be moveable at a moment's notice.

**Mobility of Trailer and/or Recreational Vehicle:**

- Trailers and/or RVs parked and unattended beyond the paid-for stay will be considered abandoned and towed/impounded at the owner's expense.

**Failure to comply with these Camping Rules & Regulations and/or Campground Conduct is cause for immediate termination of camping services with NO refunds, and immediate removal from Fairgrounds and Campground property. Sole discretion and judgement belongs to the Camp Host and/or the Property Manager. Trespassing Admonishment by Langley Police may occur for failure to comply.**
