Welcome Back to South Whidbey Harbor!

As we navigate through this unprecedented time in our lives, I would like to thank you all for your patience and understanding. We will be opening the Harbor to transient moorage (both overnight and day-stops) on Friday, May 29th. We will be accepting limited reservations during Phase 2, keeping physical distancing paramount. This means that in the inner harbor there will be only one vessel per slip and on the breakwater (D and E docks) there will be one vessel per slip with absolutely no rafting.

As we reopen, please note these changes in the Harbor:

- **New check out time is 11:00 a.m.** We hope this frees up some slip time for our day stop guests. Check in time is 2:00 p.m.
- Slip B-12 is now assigned to a permanent moorage customer. Slip M-9 has been added for transient overnight moorage guests and can accommodate vessels up to 33' LOA (length overall)

As usual, we do not take reservations for day-stops. Instead, we ask you to call the Harbor before you leave your home port to check availability. Please keep in mind that all vessels in the Harbor after 4:00 p.m. will pay the overnight moorage rate.

Please note that during Phase 2, the central business district of Langley requires the wearing of masks for all visitors, guests, customers and locals.

Finally, please find South Whidbey Harbor on Facebook, where we can disseminate information much quicker than a newsletter. We look forward to seeing you all again and ask for patience, respect and calm as we go forward.
