Minutes of the Public Hearing for the 2022 Budget November 9, 2021 Held via Zoom Meeting Service

Commissioners Present: Curt Gordon (Clinton), Jack Ng (Freeland) and Ed Halloran (Langley)

Port Staff Present: Stan Reeves (Executive Director), Molly MacLeod-Roberts (Port Clerk/Accountant), Patrick Boin (Harbormaster) and Pat Kisch (Maintenance and Operations Supervisor)

CALL TO ORDER: The Public Hearing for the 2022 Budget of the Port District of South Whidbey Island was convened by the Board of Commissioners on Tuesday, November 9, 2021, via Zoom Meeting Service. Commissioner Curt Gordon, President, opened the Public Hearing at 4:00 p.m.

PUBLIC HEARING: The previously published 2022 Preliminary Budget was available for the public. Executive Director Stan Reeves reported the following changes were made to the budget after the Commission approved it for publication at the regular October meeting:

Bush Pt Disbursements

- Line #86 Maintenance & Repair: Increased from \$1,500 to \$14,000
- Line #90 Minor Improvements: Reduced from \$10,000 to \$3,000

Maintenance & Operations Supervisor Pat Kisch had obtained an estimate on the cost to replace the hinges on the floats at both Bush Pt and Possession Beach, and the estimate for Bush Pt is approximately \$11,000. The Port will need to repair the floats before launching them in the spring, so he adjusted the items accordingly.

Possession Disbursements

• Line #134 – Dock & Ramp: Increased from \$3,000 to \$22,000 The floats at Possession were hit very hard by the wakes from large ships passing through the area; Kisch does not believe they can be reinstalled without the repair estimated at \$21,000.

South Whidbey Harbor Disbursements

- Line #155 Equip (Purchase/Rent/Repair): Increased from \$1,500 to \$2,000 The budget was increased to allow for the purchase of a new trailer for the workboat.
- Line #159 Maintenance & Repair: Increased from \$12,000 to \$15,000 The budget includes the estimated \$11,000 cost to replace several of the whalers in the inner harbor.

Gordon noted that the Port might be able to get grant funding from the Washington State Recreation & Conservation Office's Boating Facilities Program to help pay for the float repairs.

Capital Revenue

• Line #179 – WSDA Fairgrounds Grant: Previously \$0; entered \$250,000 Reeves has submitted an application for \$250,000 for renovation of one of the restrooms at the Fairgrounds.

Capital Expenditures

• Line #185 – Fairgrounds Capital Improvements: Increased from \$1,374,875 to \$1,636,190 The increase is to include the Port's match for the WSDA Fairgrounds Grant program.

Per Gordon's request, Reeves had included the breakdown of the General Fund and the Bond Fund in the 2022 Budget, for the Actual Beginning Cash at January 1, 2021; the Estimated Ending Cash at December 31, 2021; and the Estimated Ending Cash at December 31, 2022.

There were no members of the public in attendance who wished to speak.

ADJOURNMENT: Without any public comment, the Public Hearing was closed at 4:15 p.m.
