Port Update:

Stan Reeves gave a report on the current projects/status of the ongoing Port projects throughout the Port District. Fairgrounds budget execution and graphs through September 2021.

Fairgrounds Update:

Funding/grant statuses:

The Port has received check for \$27k from grant, expecting \$21k check from the County in the next 30 days. In addition, the Port has submitted an application to the WA State Dept of Agriculture for their Fair program for \$250k.

Coffman kitchen project:

The City of Langley has approved the permit, and the Port will be going back to the city for final review, followed by payment of permitting fees. Targeting the end of the year, January at the latest, for award of the contract for this work. Horse barns:

There was a recent engineering review of horse barns, and Barn 3 will need a new roof. The rest of structure is sound and could last for many years to come. Work is underway to assess options to address the roof. Fairgrounds director:

No update at yet. The job description is under review with some potential changes to minimize the scope of the role.

2022 event request intake and scheduling:

Requests for 2022 events are coming in. The goal is to have all scheduling complete in January.

Old Business:
